Fall Community Service Events:

Habitat for Humanity: Habitat for Humanity International is a nonprofit, ecumenical Christian housing ministry. Habitat for Humanity seeks to eliminate poverty housing and homelessness from the world, and to make decent shelter a matter of conscience and action. On September 22, 2007, from 8:00 A.M. - 1:00 P.M., fifty-seven brothers from the Sigma Chi Epsilon Upsilon Chapter, at Arizona State University, volunteered at HFH. For many hours we laid drywall at the Sojourner Center, a shelter for battered women and children.

Save the Family: Save The Family is one of the Valley's Family Crisis Center, providing homes, rebuilding families and supporting self-sufficiency. Volunteers for The Save the Family organization help children in homeless families by treating the whole family with programs to break the negative cycles of poverty, abuse, and homelessness. On October 6, 2007, from 7:30 A.M.-12:30 P.M., forty-five brothers from the Sigma Chi Epsilon Upsilon Chapter, at Arizona State University, along with 30 other individuals from Live Church, TV, volunteered for five hours cleaning and painting houses for homeless families.

United Blood Services Blood Drive:

United Blood Services exists to make a difference in people's lives by bringing together the best people, inspiring individuals to donate blood, producing a safe and ample blood supply, advancing cutting-edge research and embracing continuous quality improvement. On October 30, 2007, brothers from the Sigma Chi Epsilon Upsilon Chapter, at Arizona State University, planned and coordinated a blood drive with United Blood Services. The

blood drive took place from 10:00 A.M. - 3:00 P.M. A total of fifty-seven Arizona State University Sigma Chi's donated blood!
